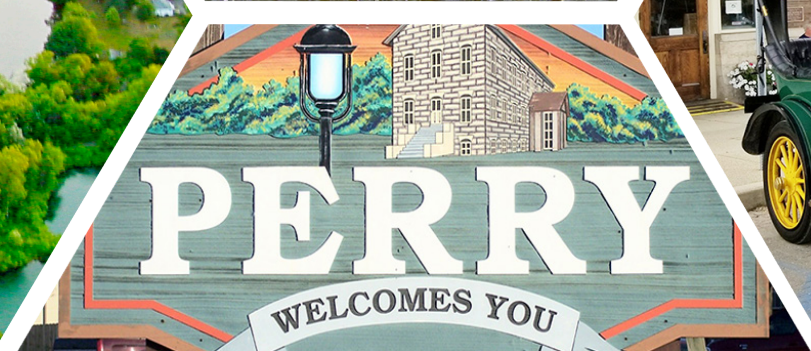

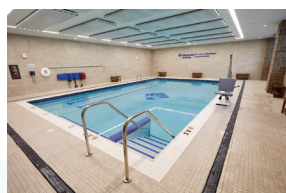

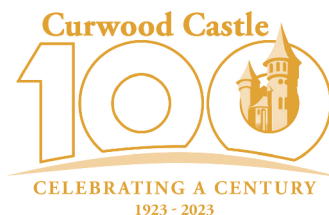

CURWOOD CASTLE

Sitting on a bend along the Shiawassee River is one of Owosso's most iconic buildings. Curwood Castle, located in Curwood Castle Park, is one of Owosso's most visited tourist stops attracting visitors from all over the world. Walking into Curwood Castle is like stepping into a magical place from days gone by. Guests can explore the four levels of the castle including the tallest turret.

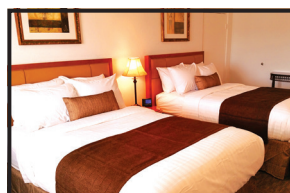
This year Curwood Castle is celebrating its 100 anniversary. The Castle, built in 1923, was the writing studio of author/conservationist/early movie pioneer James Oliver Curwood. On the main floor of the turret, he would write action-adventure stories that appealed to readers of all ages. During his lifetime, James Oliver was one of the highest-paid authors (per word) in the world as his stories were printed in many different languages. His stories were so popular that Hollywood came calling and have made over 200 of his novels, short stories, screenplays, and scenarios into films.

Curwood Castle is open April through December on Tuesdays through Sundays 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. only closing on Mondays and major holidays. James Oliver Curwood – Writer, Conservationist, Visionary, Iconoclast, Imaginer and Movie Pioneer – created Curwood Castle to serve as his writing and conservation studio. Curwood, one of America's foremost authors of adventure novels and an early advocate of environmental conservation, skillfully created a replica of a French Norman chateau on the banks of his beloved Shiawassee River. At least 230 motion pictures have been based on or directly inspired by his novels and short stories. Building began in 1922 and was completed in 1923. Curwood Castle was used by Curwood until his death in 1927.

Curwood Castle is part of the Curwood Collection, managed by the Owosso Historical Commission. The collection includes the **Comstock Pioneer Cabin** and the **Woodard Paymaster Building**, both located at Curwood Castle Park.

THE SHIAWASSEE RIVER

Shiawassee County is named for its principal river the Shiawassee. The river is about 110 miles long – 88 miles of it, between Holly and Chesaning, has been designated a State Water Trail. Its waters support fish and other wildlife species, including some designated as rare and endangered. We encourage you to spend a relaxed afternoon exploring this treasured water resource. CANOEING AND KAYAKING

Why has the Shiawassee River been considered one of the top places to paddle in Michigan? With serene, scenic landscapes, and an easy, meandering flow, the river offers a diverse range of paddling experiences for canoeists and kayakers of all abilities - very suitable for families in a canoe or groups of novice kayak paddlers. Experienced paddlers will enjoy the many twists and turns along the way. Strong paddlers occasionally paddle upstream against the current a few miles and then leisurely coast back to the put-in for a good workout on the water. FISHING & WILDLIFE

The Shiawassee River is classified as a large, warmwater river, supporting over 61 species of fish, and is a favorite of anglers in search of smallmouth bass. Other species include northern pike, channel catfish, walleye, and more. It is common to see beaver, muskrat, great blue heron, white-tailed deer, osprey, and kingfisher. Be sure to keep your eye out for bald eagles as well.

BIKE SHIAWASSEE COUNTY

Biking at every level is a favorite pastime in Shiawassee County. With biking trails and miles and miles of back roads, your biking options are limitless. Along with the leisurely bike ride, Shiawassee County is proud to have several organized rides on a weekly basis, spring through fall. 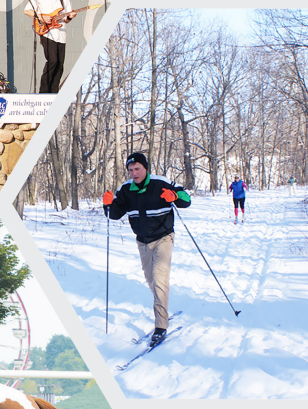

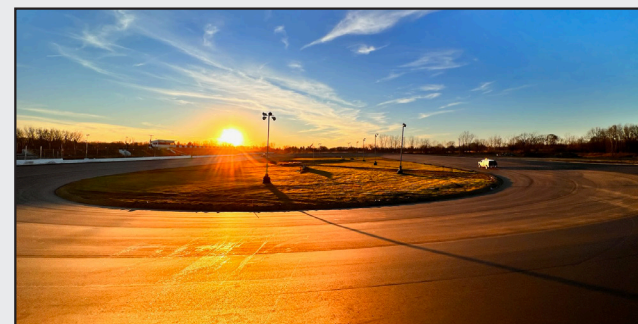

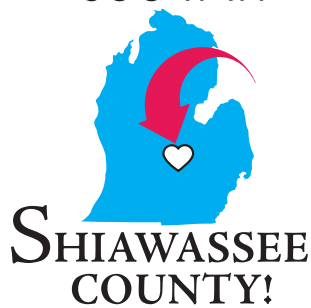
