# Happy 150th Birthday FREDERICK C. FRIESEKE!

Called one of the “culminating figures among American Impressionists”, Frederick C. Frieseke was born in Owosso in 1874 to German-American parents. His childhood home at 654 North Water Street was built of bricks from his father’s brick plant as were many additional houses and buildings in Owosso.

After graduating from Owosso High School in 1893 Frieseke studied painting at the Chicago Art Institute and the Art Students League in New York. In 1898 at the age of 24, he headed for Paris with \$500 his father had given him. From then on, although he returned to the United States occasionally for shows or to meet with his agent, Frieseke became an expatriate: living - working, marrying and dying in France at the age of 65 in 1939.

During his lifetime Frieseke was an artist of renown who won many awards and exhibited his paintings often in Europe and the United States. In 1926 Frieseke donated a painting, Lady with the Sunshade, c.1910 to the City of Owosso. The painting is on long term loan to the Shiawassee Arts Center and is displayed in the Frieseke Gallery along with three additional original paintings and many reproductions.

**James Oliver Curwood** – Writer, Conservationist, Visionary, Iconoclast, Imaginer and Movie Pioneer – created Curwood Castle to serve as his writing and conservation studio. Curwood, one of America's foremost authors of adventure novels and an early advocate of environmental conservation, skillfully created a replica of a French Norman chateau on the banks of his beloved Shiawassee River. At least 230 motion pictures have been based on or directly inspired by his novels and short stories. Building began in 1922 and was completed in 1923. Curwood Castle was used by Curwood until his death in 1927.

Curwood Castle is part of the Curwood Collection, managed by the Owosso Historical Commission. The collection includes the **Comstock Pioneer Cabin** and the **Woodard Paymaster Building**, both located at Curwood Castle Park.

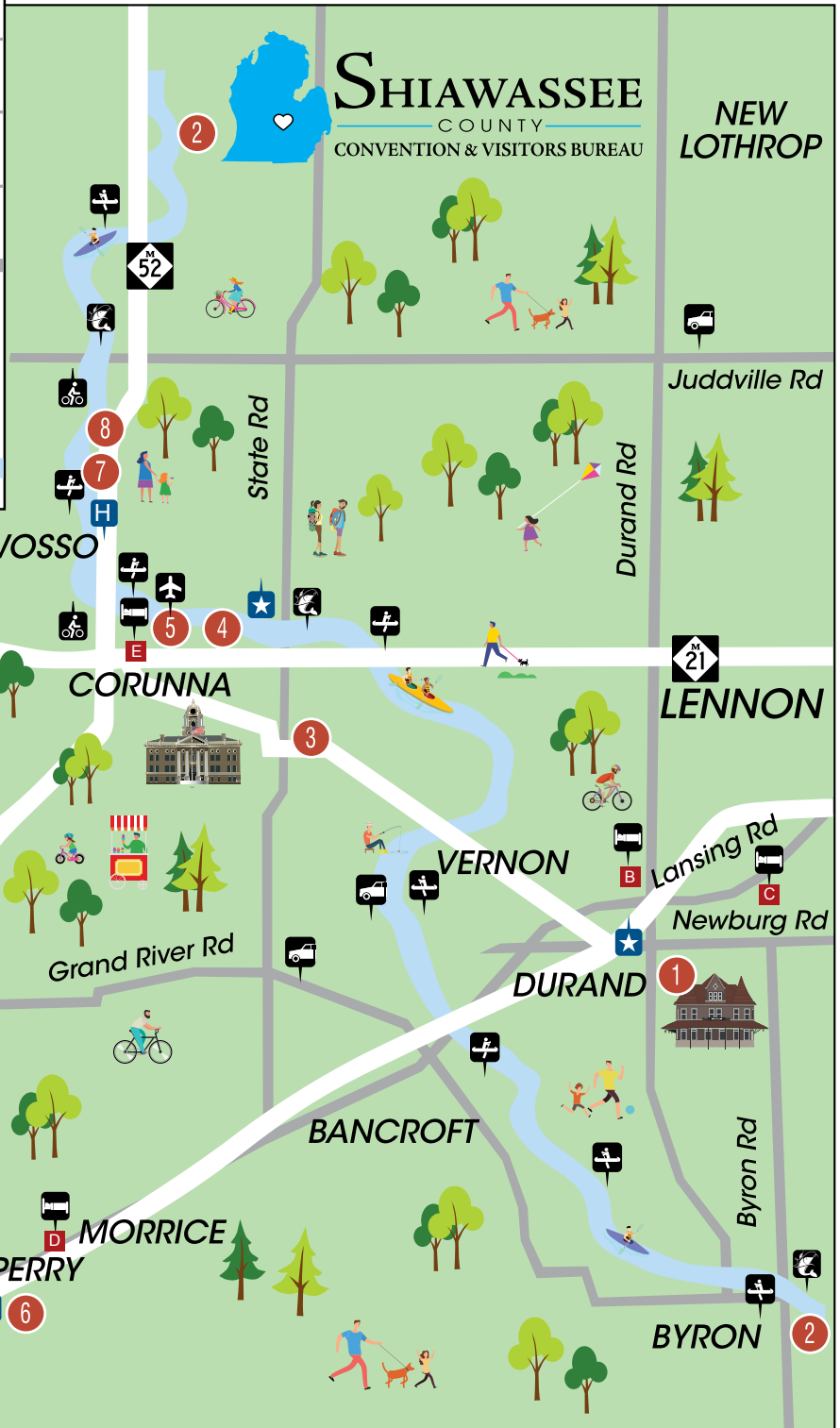

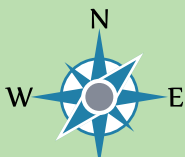

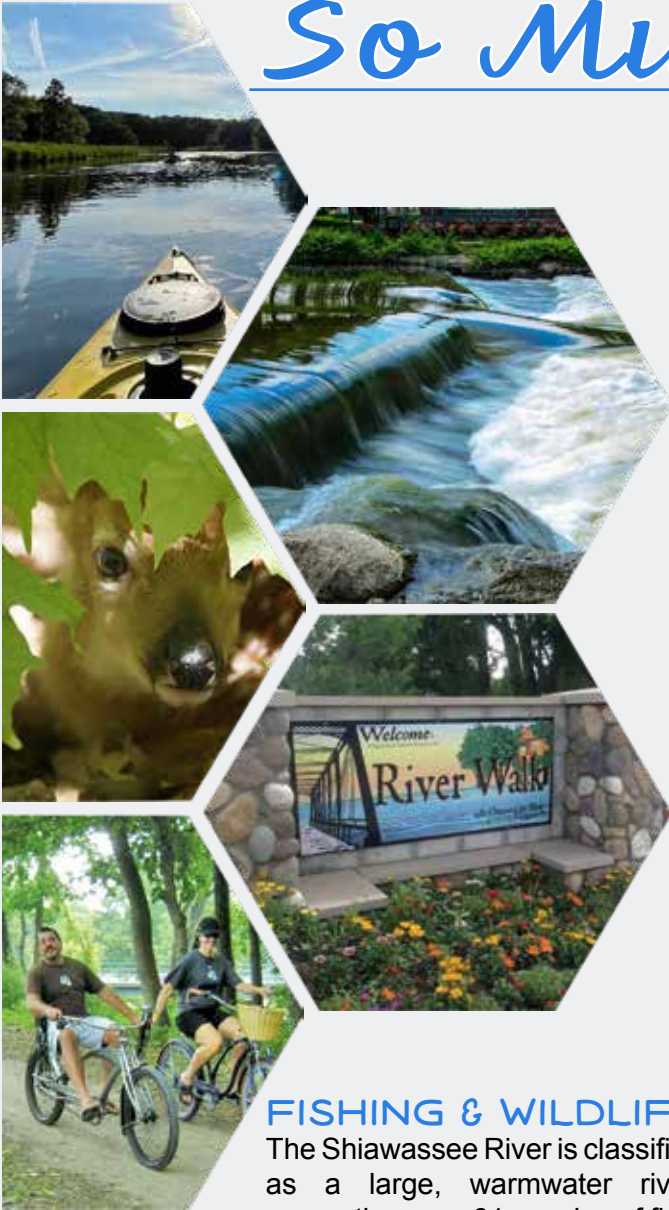

## THE SHIAWASSEE RIVER

Shiawassee County is named for its principal river the Shiawassee. The river is about 110 miles long – 88 miles of it, between Holly and Chesaning, has been designated a State Water Trail. Its waters support fish and other wildlife species, including some designated as rare and endangered. We encourage you to spend a relaxed afternoon exploring this treasured water resource. ## CANOEING AND KAYAKING

Why has the Shiawassee River been considered one of the top places to paddle in Michigan? With serene, scenic landscapes, and an easy, meandering flow, the river offers a diverse range of paddling experiences for canoeists and kayakers of all abilities - very suitable for families in a canoe or groups of novice kayak paddlers. Experienced paddlers will enjoy the many twists and turns along the way. Strong paddlers occasionally paddle upstream against the current a few miles and then leisurely coast back to the put-in for a good workout on the water. The Friends of the Shiawassee River offers an online brochure, highlighting river access sites and mileage/paddle times, for sections of the river from Byron to Chesaning. ## FISHING & WILDLIFE

The Shiawassee River is classified as a large, warmwater river, supporting over 61 species of fish, and is a favorite of anglers in search of smallmouth bass. Other species include northern pike, channel catfish, walleye, and more. It is common to see beaver, muskrat, great blue heron, white-tailed deer, osprey, and kingfisher. Be sure to keep your eye out for bald eagles as well.

## JAMES S. MINER RIVER WALK

Nestled along the river is a five mile River Walk, beginning in Corunna's McCurdy Park and ending in Owosso's Harmon-Partridge Park. It winds and curves along the river and is literally a sightseeing splendor passing by dozens of the areas best attractions. The Sam & Opal Voight loop trail also wraps along both the north and south sides of the river, adding another mile to walk, bike or run.

## BIKE SHIAWASSEE COUNTY

Biking at every level is a favorite pastime in Shiawassee County. With biking trails and miles and miles of back roads, your biking options are limitless. Along with the leisurely bike ride, Shiawassee County is proud to have several organized rides on a weekly basis, spring through fall. 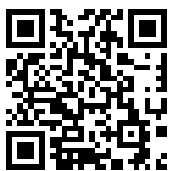
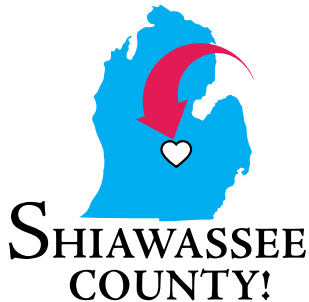
